

What's Up in Riverchase Annual Meeting

Question and Answer Section

The questions below were **submitted prior** to the meeting, and answers were provided during the Ring Central meeting on March 11, 2021. Questions submitted **during** the meeting are being researched, and will be addressed

in the June/July Newsletter, and/or via a future email from CMA.

1. Why was the gate removed at the entrance to Willow Oak?

Prior to 2000, a homeowner lodged a lawsuit regarding the gate. Ultimately, Shelby County ruled a public street could not be blocked off. A key factor involved was emergency vehicle access and response time.

2. How much is the RRA partnership with Riverchase Country Club utilized ?

Roughly 100 rounds of golf were played and over 100 different families accessed take-out food service utilizing the partnership April 2019 – May 2020. Since May of 2020 an additional 20 homeowners have signed up to use the partnership during the Pandemic. Utilization is tracked by CMA effective May of 2020 and the partnership is reviewed annually.

3. Is an HOA Closing Letter required and if so, how much should it cost?

An HOA closing letter is necessary because it ensures that the Closing Attorney collects all fees – past due fees and present fees, at the time of closing. This protects the new homeowner from having a lien being placed on the property due to the seller not paying their HOA dues. Closing letters can range from \$150 and up. Many times the cost is high due to the closing agent waiting until the last minute and rush fees being added on.

4. Can a sign be erected at the new park by Riverchase Elementary with the name of the park?

A sign is a great idea. The name of the park is Cahaba-Riverchase Greenway. This will be added to New Business in March for the new Board to delve into with the City.

5. Could a survey be designed by the Board for all homeowners to gather input regarding overall satisfaction with social events, compliance, the management company, etc?

This is a great idea. This will also be added to the Agenda for the next Board Meeting to assign a small task force to develop a questionnaire.

6. What is the process for large items placed on the street and why does pick up take so long?

The city says most homeowners do not call upon initially placing the items out for pick up. The best way to notify the city of the large items is to download the app. MyHooverConnect. Take a photo of the item(s) and post it on the app for pick up. The city knows exactly the size and can coordinate with other pick-ups more efficiently using the app, but placing a phone call also works (205.631.1313). The app can also be downloaded off the city's website. <u>www.hooveral.org</u> Go to Public Works, Scroll to bottom of page under FAQ's, first question is how to handle pick up of debris, limbs and bulky items. Click on that question and you are directed to all you need to know and the link to download the app.

7. Who are primary contacts for issues involving the RRA and/or CMA?
