

How to participate in the parade:

TIPS AND REMINDERS

FROM YOUR FRIENDLY, NEIGHBORHOOD BEAUTIFCATION COMMITTEE

- Make sure all doghouses, garbage/recycling receptacles and hoses are out of site.
- Be sure your landscaping is in top shape. Make sure grass is mowed and clippings removed. Remove all weeds, prune trees and scrubs and edge grass along curb.
- Be mindful of how your gutters, drives
- Remove leaves and refresh mulch in your natural areas
- Curb and gutter free of debris
- Edging Borders and Landscape Timbers--No rocks in front and side yards, Metal edging is permitted b/t grass and natural areas if green or brown, No black plastic edging, Cross ties/landscape timber's not used in front yard without approval.
- Foundation Planting—Evergreen scrubs planted along front of foundation.
- Gardens—Vegetables, Herbs, and Flowers for cutting—backyard
- Sod--Front and side yards Sod except where ARC approved natural area; Minimum of 4ft. sod behind curb for entire length of property line; Small natural areas around mailbox and public utilities permitted; Areas where sod required is too shady, dwarf mondo is accepted.
- Lighting—One gas light or free standing fixture and driveway and walkways lights 16 inches high color-black, bronze, copper or green.
- Mailbox—maintained in good repair .
- Yard Fixtures and Furnishings--Four items total on front porch, front and side yards; Front porch containers 30 inches tall max; Not permitted in front yard: Bird Houses, reflective balls, or anything hanging; No Plastic anything's—furniture or plants.
- In general : House and chimney in good condition

Did you know that there are 17 different "monuments" with the name of our neighborhood or other small subdivisions scattered through Riverchase. The upkeep and care of these monuments are the responsibility of the RRA and they are on a regular schedule for inspection and maintenance. If you see something that is not up to Riverchase standards associated with one of our monuments please do not attempt to repair water or electrical issues yourself. Your efforts may result in personal injury or interfere with the work of our professional venders. If you have questions or concerns, please contact Stephanie with CMA.
